Cody Post has been a lifetime resident of Wayne County and is currently a Lieutenant on the Chippewa Township FD and the 911 Operations Supervisor for the Wooster-Ashland Regional Council of Governments. In 2010, Cody earned his certifications as a Paramedic and a national instructor for planning and responding to bombing and explosive incidents. In 2015 he began serving as an Intelligence Liaison Officer to Wayne County for the Ohio Department of Homeland Security.

Starting his 911 dispatch career in 2008 with the Copley Police Department, Cody has accelerated to become a leader in challenging the status quo in the 911 segment. Internationally certified in Police, Fire and Medical 911 procedures, he uses his experience and training to encourage

all his peers to pursue ongoing excellence.

Ohio BWC Workshop on Fraud

The Wooster Area Safety Council met Wednesday, January 25th, and were presented a Workshop on Health Care and Worker's Compensation Fraud from Douglas Fisher of Ohio BWC.

Mr. Fisher is currently the special agent in charge of the health care fraud investigations unit for the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation, Special Investigation Division. He manages 26 special agents located throughout the state that are responsible for the criminal investigations of medical providers, medical equipment companies and manages care organizations doing business with the state of Ohio.

Mr. Fisher shared with the Council the different types of Health Care Fraud and Workers' Comp Fraud, trends inside these types of frauds, red flags to look out for, and how they investigate these cases.

The Council learned that financial losses from healthcare fraud amount to tens of billions of dollars annually and that global healthcare fraud and error losses have risen 25 percent to 6.9 percent total since 2008.

Industry experts estimate that 5-20% of workers' compensation benefits paid are fraudulent in nature.

Some different kinds of Health Care Frauds to be on the lookout for are:

- Services not rendered – Billing for a service that was never provided
- Upcoding – Billing for a higher level of service than provided
- Unbundling – Billing for two CPT codes instead of one inclusive code resulting in a higher payment
- Double billing – Billing both BWC and another insurance agency for the same service

Some red flags to look out for are also:

- Location of patients
- Patient Doesn't Recall Service
- Notes – Cut and Paste – Nothing changes
- Vitals
- Volume of Complaints
- Codes Billed or not Billed
- Volume of patients
- Peer Comparison

We want to thank Douglas Fisher for his service to the community to keep citizens safe from health care and worker's compensation fraud, and the very helpful and informative workshop he provided for us! 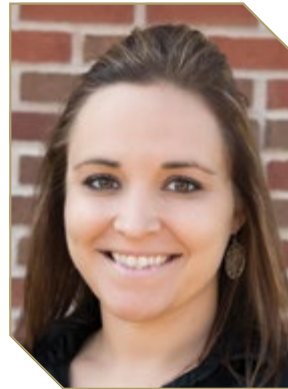
