

2019 FDUCATIONAL SERIES RECAP

The importance of protecting customer data: Privacy matters!

The Chamber hosted an Educational Series focused on the importance of protecting customer data. Joshua Montgomery of Broehl Law Office, LLC and Brian Boyer of Web Pyro shared insight as to how businesses (small and large) can protect their data from both external and internal threats. Detailed examples of practices that businesses can implement to limit data breaches and protect valuable information were provided to attendees.

Joshua covered the legal aspects of why it's important to protect customer data. He shared that 50 percent of small business data breaches come from cyber attacks. Businesses should have physical and technical safeguards in place including a cyber-security program. Joshua covered the main points of Ohio's Data Protection Act and how it aims to

incentivize companies to have strong security practices in place.

Brian talked about ways to keep your data secure. He stressed the importance of not believing everything you see and ways to avoid falling for scams. Determining what data should be stored and for how long are questions companies should be asking. Strong passwords will go a long way to help protect information.

Previously Dan was CFO and Principle Partner of Wilson Farms Inc, a convenience store chain with 200 locations in New York State. Dan. together with the Nanula Family and BRS, a private equity group, acquired Wilson Farms from Royal Ahold in 2005 and subsequently sold to 7-Eleven in 2011. While with Wilson Farms Dan served on the Board of the New York Association of Convenience Stores, was a member of the Legislative Committee and was elected Chairman of the Association in 2011.

Before acquiring Wilson Farms Dan was Division Vice President for Tops/ Ahold overseeing 240 stores in Upstate New York and Vice President of Supply Chain for the \$3 billion Ahold division.

In the late 90's Dan was a key executive in the Ahold expansion into Asia serving as CEO and Country Manager for Singapore and Malaysia, forming a joint venture with the Kuok group, a prominent Conglomerate in Asia and the Pacific Rim, and opening 88 stores in four years. During that time Dan, his wife Rose and their five children lived in Singapore and in Kuala Lumpur.

Dan's education consists of an MBA and B.S in Economics from Canisius College. Dan finished first in his MBA class receiving the Prentice Hall outstanding student award and being inducted into the Beta Gamma Sigma Honor Society.

Safety Council Recap: Dangers of heat exhaustion, heat stroke and ways to stay safe when it gets hot outside

The Wooster Area Safety Council concluded the 2018 Safety Council year Wednesday, June 26, 2019 with a meeting at First Presbyterian Church in Wooster.



Mike Berry spoke about the dangers of heat exhaustion and heat stroke and ways to stay safe when the summer temperatures rise. He described the symptoms of heat stroke such as, dizziness, muscle weakness or cramps. If you notice someone displaying these

symptoms the best things to do are: find a cool place - an air conditioned room is best and drink cold water. He shared a video to demonstrate how dangerous it is to leave children and pets inside hot cars. Staying hydrated is one of the best ways to avoid heat stroke and he explained this is especially important for athletes who are practicing outside in the summer heat.

Mike is a 19 year veteran of the Wooster Division of Fire. Along with his duties as a Firefighter and Fire Inspector, Mike is a State of Ohio certified Paramedic. He is also an

Internationally **Certified Fire** Investigator and American Heart Association CPR Instructor.

Upcoming August Safety Council: "Stop the Bleed" with IOF

Jeff Wilson and Ethan Frontz, of Instruments of Freedom, will be speaking on "Stop the Bleed" at the next Safety Council meeting on August 28.

When dealing with an arterial bleed. every second counts. 30,000 lives each year

could be saved if more people knew how to control massive hemorrhaging. Accidents can happen at any time. Carrying and knowing the proper application of a tourniquet can make all the difference for keeping an injured person alive. Remember, when seconds count, emergency services are only minutes away...


