
According to the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, there was an increase in sexual harassment cases from 2017 to 2018. Kim began by explaining that sexual harassment can have adverse effects on your workplace including high turnover rates, bad reputation, and loss of productivity. A great way to combat sexual harassment in your workplace, is to have strategies in place such as having a sound discrimination/ harassment policy, training employees, implementing clear procedures, and following those policies and procedures. Ms. Hall also stated that a detailed, unbiased investigation is paramount when trying to uncover the truth behind a sexual harassment complaint.
