## Board of Directors welcomes Day as 2020 Chair

Kevin Day, President and CEO of the Western Reserve Group was named the 2020 Wooster Chamber Board of Directors Chair. 

## Safety Recap: Heroin and opiates in the Wayne County area

Captain Doug Hunter, of the Wayne County Sheriff's Office, spoke at the December Safety Council meeting about heroin and other opiates in the Wayne County area.



Captain Hunter has witnessed how drug use has changed over his 40-year career with the Sheriff's Office. When he began recreational use of opiates was nearly unheard of in the area. He largely attributes the rise in opiate abuse to the overprescribing of prescription pain medications. He pointed out that many people who have developed a drug addiction did not set out to abuse drugs. They may have been injured and prescribed a medication that led to the addiction.

He shared several stories of his experiences involving people struggling with drug addiction. Because of his position with the Sheriff's Office, most of his experiences have a tragic ending.



The group learned about different signs to watch for in employees and coworkers that could indicate a drug problem. Captain Hunter also cautioned that not everyone will show the obvious signs of drug abuse.

## Get to know the Wooster Chamber Board members!



Tom White 2020 Wooster Area Chamber of Commerce Board Member

Tom White first became familiar with Wooster through his district manager role with Quality Farm and Fleet. When Quality went out of business in the early 2000s, Tom had the vision to reopen the Wooster store and bring the Wayne County farming community the kind of personalized service and community involvement often lacking in big box retail stores. In the fall of 2004, this vision materialized as Rural King of Ohio or — as most call it — RKO, opened. Tom opened a second store in Elyria in 2011.

Rural King's roots began as a small, family-owned farm store in 1960 based in Mattoon, IL., and has grown to serve customers with a large variety of products, such as

livestock supplies, clothing, hardware, and compact RK tractors from 19 to 55 horsepower. When RKO first opened it was the only store in Ohio and enjoyed customers that drove from all over the state of Ohio, western Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. When you enter you cannot help but smell the free popcorn, a staple, along with the everyday low prices and friendly service. And your dog, on a leash, is always welcome.

In 2017, Tom sold the business and retired from a 'regular paying job' to a life filled with volunteering and spending time on the family farm in Guernsey County, where he was the 5th generation to grow up.

Along with his Chamber activities, Tom is a Master Gardner at OSU Secrest Arboretum, supports the Wayne County Fair, and serves on the board of Habitat for Humanity. He also loves to spend time restoring antique Ford tractors and — much to his wife's concern — has grown his collection to about 15 tractors (and counting). Only a few more to round out the collection and he will be all set! (At least until the next auction ...)

Tom is a Navy veteran and served a tour of duty in Vietnam. Returning home, he used the GI bill to acquire his degree from Ohio University, the first in his family to attend college. He and his bride of 32 years, Sandy have two children. Will, who will be graduating from The Ohio State University this spring with his law degree, and Katie, who earned her master's degree from lowa and is teaching at The University of Akron and Mount Union while also working at Starbucks. Before returning to Ohio, the Whites lived in Grand Haven, Michigan for ten years while Tom worked in the corporate offices for Quality. Even then, the family continued to visit the Wayne and Holmes counties area every summer and loved it here.

RKO still holds a special place in Tom's heart and he feels blessed by the support he received from the community when he opened his store. It is with that gratitude that he enjoys giving back to his adopted community of Wooster.

## Major improvements coming to Southeast and Southwest quadrants of public square



Downtown will continue to see improvements, after City Council approved proceeding with the implementation of phase II of an overall downtown streetscape renovation master plan. The first phase, which was completed in 2018, included the redesign of the Northeast Quad of public square and the creation of the new multi-purpose pavilion. The most recent phase will focus on improving the southeast and southwest quads of public square. This project is slated to begin in spring 2020, and will include improving the streetscape along Liberty Street from Market Street east to the first alley, the reconfiguration of both the Southeast and Southwest Quads, and the area along Liberty Street west of Market Street south side to the first alley. This \$1.8M project will complete the reconfiguration and revitalization of Wooster's public square along with the replacement of a larger majority of the original streetscape.
