





July Safety Council Recap: Exoskeleton Technology in the Workplace

The Wooster Area Safety Council concluded the 2017 Safety Council Year by meeting on Wednesday, June 27th at First Presbyterian Church in Wooster. The group heard from Dr. Delia Treaster, Ergonomic Technical Advisor for the BWC. Dr. Treaster spoke about the rising use of Exoskeleton technology in the workplace. Exoskeleton technology is beginning to revolutionize workplace safety as we know it. This technology can decrease the amount of strain on a worker by helping to lift and support weight. According to Delia, there

are currently only a few models in the United States. Dr. Treaster showed the group several videos of Exoskeletons in action. The technology can be worn like a brace and the operator is strapped in. Aside from bearing weight, exoskeletons can allow you to take a seat without needing a chair. The purpose of the technology is to

2018 Wayne County Manufacturing Day SET TO BE BETTER THAN EVER Friday, October 5th, 2018

1. Growing Participation

Wayne County was the only community in Ohio that offered participating students the opportunity to individually select what Manufacturers they wanted to visit. This personalized approach was a noted success and brought increased value to both the industry partners and the students. Such value has increased the awareness of the event, and it is anticipated that growing participation will occur this fall. Last year the event exposed more than 600 students to thirteen

the event exposed more than 600 students to thirteen manufacturers throughout Wayne County. 2018 participation projections have increased to more than 700 students and upwards of 15 manufacturers.

2. Increased Importance on Careers

Wayne County Manufacturing Day is not just a tour of a local operation, but rather a site visit that focuses on educating today's students of the careers that are available for them both right out of high school and/or after college. Retention of our youth is vital to the future strength of our Manufacturing Sector and our Community, which is the premise behind making Manufacturing Day site visits much more valuable than a standard field trip.

3. Focused on Connecting with Parents

The organizers of Wayne County Manufacturing Day are placing an increased importance on connecting with the students parents/guardians, as many are not aware of the wage and benefit package that many of our local Manufacturers offer to their employees. A concerted effort to expand the Day into an ongoing educational experience with local parents will be a 2018 priority.
