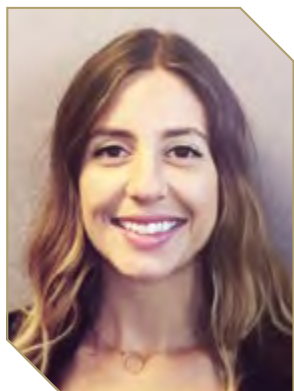

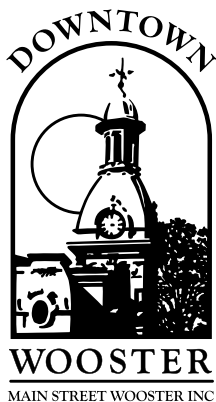

Wooster Community Hospital opens new Cancer Center

The Wooster Community Hospital Outpatient Pavilion officially opened its doors to the public on Saturday, November 4th. After more than 18 months of construction and \$30 million invested, the Wooster Community Hospital is able to offer local citizens a center that boasts 17 wellness suites, aimed at providing an inviting atmosphere for its patients.

The ground floor comprises the Comprehensive Cancer Center, a joint venture between the hospital and Ohio State University's James Cancer Network, to provide services locally for cancer patients. This decision, Sheron explained, helps provide cancer services for Wayne County residents so they don't need to travel too far from home. Patients can now meet with their oncologist, surgeon and radiation specialist all in one location once the

center starts accepting patients in the coming weeks.

The Wooster Cancer Care Physician team includes Dr. Joseph Prah, oncology/hematology; Dr. Mansour Isckarus, oncology/hematology; and Dr. Steven Walston, radiation oncologist.

The Chamber congratulates the leadership of Wooster Community Hospital for the vision and persistence in seeing this significant project to completion.

Safety Council Recap: How to Prevent Cuts at Work

The Wooster Area Safety Council convened on Wednesday, November 15th at Memories Party & Conference Center to hear from U.S. Safety Gear CEO, Tarry Alberini. Mr. Alberini educated the group on how to effectively prevent cuts and lacerations in the workplace. Mr. Alberini began by going over some important facts about workplace injuries. According to the BWC, 30% of all workplace injuries are cuts and lacerations, 70% of which are to the hands and fingers. Some of the causes for these types of injuries include lack of training, lack of enforcement to follow safety procedures, the employee is in a hurry, and not wearing proper safety equipment. According to his experience, not wearing the proper safety equipment is the number one cause of cut and slash injuries. These types of workplace injuries are more common in certain industries such as Poultry Processing, Food Processing, Plastics, and Steel Processing.

There are several ways to prevent cuts and lacerations in the workplace. Some preventative measures include proper employee training, assessing the safety of the job, and wearing proper safety equipment. For jobs with a high risk of cuts and lacerations, wearing cut resistant gloves, sleeves and aprons will greatly decrease the chance of injury.

The Chamber would like to thank Tarry for taking the time to speak to our Wooster Area Safety Council. We hope those in attendance found value in the presentation and we look forward to seeing everyone in December!





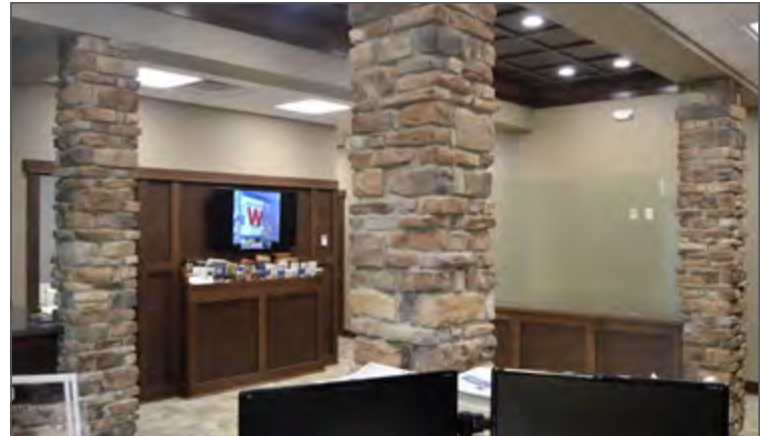
Wooster Chamber Building Renovation

Congrats to Schaeffler on 40 Years in the Wooster area!

The Chamber would like to congratulate Schaeffler who celebrated their 40th year in Wooster and the commissioning of their new 80,000 square foot stamping facility on the company's Wooster campus on Old Airport Road. Schaeffler invited dignitaries, domestic and international customers and the company's European based ownership to Wooster on Wednesday, November 1st to share in the celebration.

Numerous vehicles showcasing Schaeffler's torque converters — of which it has made 22 million since 1997 — and a tour of the new space was provided following company leaders' remarks. Marc McGrath, President of Schaeffler's American Operation, explained that making torque converters when the company started in Wooster 40 years ago was

a "disruption" in the industry, as the majority of vehicles were still manual transmissions.

Today, Schaeffler is seeing better than 10 percent growth annually, McGrath said, on the continued success of its products in more and more vehicles, including semi-trucks.

That growth is only primed to continue, as the company is now focusing on the next disruption — electrification of the automotive powertrain — which McGrath said the Wooster plant will begin producing next year.

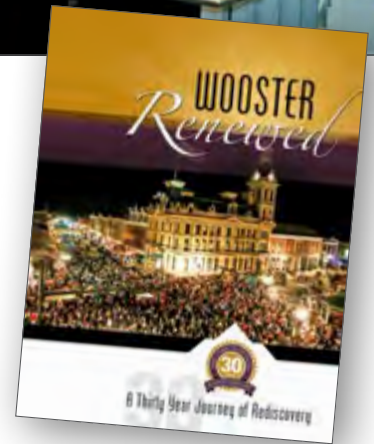


MAIN STREET WOOSTER INC.
