The 2017 Chamber Facility & Property Renovation Project



THE PROJECT

We are excited to announce plans to improve and update the Chamber Complex Facility, which houses the Wooster Area Chamber of Commerce, Farm Bureau, and Main Street Wooster. Purchased by the Chamber in 1992, the facility lacks the functionality and image that visitors would expect from such organizations within a vibrant community. With the growth of Wooster and Wayne County in recent years, the Chamber facility has become a hub of activity for new community members, new businesses, and various stakeholder meetings. After a thorough analysis of available downtown properties and future needs of the above organizations, it was determined that revitalizing and reconfiguring the Chamber Complex Facility was a financially prudent plan that would serve all well. The project includes the complete reconfiguration of the offices for the three organizations, the creation of an updated community lobby that will welcome visitors and members alike, along with the creation of a 50 person conference room. We are seeking voluntary contributions from their memberships toward the \$385,000 project through naming right opportunities, recognized tiered donations, and in-kind contributions.

BENEFITS OF THE PROJECT

This project will create a professional and aesthetically pleasing space that the community and membership can be proud of, while creating an efficient reconfigured floor plan that will support the current day and future growth needs of the Chamber, Farm Bureau, and Main Street Wooster. The project will also offer non-profit organizations and business members the opportunity to utilize the 50 person conference room during and after business hours. With a lack of available conference rooms throughout the community, this will meet the needs of many.

Medical Marijuana in Ohio: What the employer needs to know



DR. RICHARD REICHERT. MD MPH of MedPro Group IME, LLC



The Wooster Area Safety Council will meet Wednesday, June 28th to hear from Dr. Richard Reichert, MD, MPH of MedPro Group IME, LLC about Medical Marijuana in Ohio and what the employer needs to know.

This presentation will address the current status of legalizing medical marijuana in Ohio including employer responsibilities and options regarding medical marijuana use by employees. Dr. Reichert will present medical evidence regarding the health benefits of medical marijuana as well as review conditions which are eligible for medical marijuana use in Ohio.

Dr. Richard Reichert is the Company Physician for The Timken Company. Dr. Reichert is Board Certified in Occupational Medicine and earned a Doctorate of Medicine from the Medical College of Ohio in Toledo, a Master's Degree in Public Health from the Medical College of Wisconsin and a Bachelor's Degree in Biology from Walsh College. He Completed his Family Practice Residency at the Toledo Hospital and Occupational Medicine training at the University of Cincinnati.

Dr. Reichert founded two Centers for Occupational Medicine: the first in Canton, Ohio in 1988 and is now known as US Healthworks; and the second ion 1997 in Wooster, Ohio now known as MedPro Group. He continues his involvement in both practices. Outside of medicine, Dr. Reichert is also a former Lieutenant Commander in the US Navy.

Safety Council Recap: Conceal and Carry in the Workplace

The Wooster Area Safety Council met Wednesday, May 24th at Memories Party & Conference Center. Co-founder of Three Sixty Defense LLC, Tiffany Noe, spoke about Conceal and Carry rules and regulations in the workplace. Tiffany discussed Ohio law regarding concealed carry in the workplace, things to consider regarding allowing concealed carry in the work place, and benefits of concealed carry in the workplace. Mrs. Noe pointed out that employers are required to notify their employees in clear, legible terms whether or not they are allowed to be in possession of a firearm at work. This means posting a sign, not just having it in the employee handbook. Mrs. Noe also spoke on concealed carry rules for a business that is located in a leased building.

Toward the end of her presentation, Mrs. Noe went over the signs of a potential violent employee. Some of these signs include disrespect for authority, poor handling of criticism, isolation, and many more.

We want to thank Tiffany for presenting to the Wooster Area Safety Council and are confident that the information she presented will benefit local members by helping them make educated choices regarding whether or not to allow concealed carry in the workplace.






