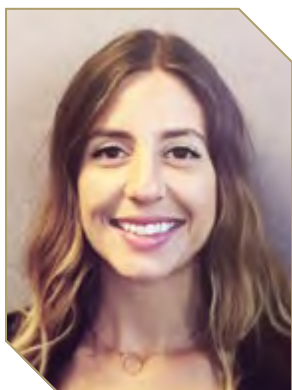

LOCAL MANUFACTURERS TO HOST TOURS FOR STUDENTS

The United States economy is at a crossroads. The economy is still in a recovery process from the 2008 recession. American businesses continue to ramp up production to meet a growing, global demand in many different industries across the spectrum. But businesses need more qualified and drug-free workers to meet global demands.

Right here in Wayne County, countless businesses - particularly in the manufacturing sector - are at the forefront of this challenge to keep up with demand from their customers and are in need of a quality workforce in our own backyard.

Gone are the days of the past where manufacturing factories were seen as dark, dirty and dangerous. Today's facilities are cleaner and safer than ever. But they still face an uphill battle to attract young, quality workers.

This is where events across the nation, such as Wayne County's Manufacturing Day, help to connect potential workers with quality employers. And this year's event serves to be the largest day in its fourth year and one of the largest in the state of Ohio.

"We feel extremely fortunate to have every school district and 13 of our industry partners collaborating and making this day possible," said Justin Starlin, president of the Wooster Area Chamber of Commerce.

"Attracting and retaining quality, young talent in our community is vital to the overall strength and long-term prosperity of our local economy. We feel events such as Manufacturing Day serves as one of the most important steps in achieving this by making the younger generation aware of the career opportunities locally and that the greener pastures indeed exist here, and not elsewhere," Starlin said.

More than 500 high school-aged students will get a first-hand look at top employers such as LuK, Artiflex, Akron Brass and countless others.

Wayne County's Manufacturing Day - presented in a collaborative effort with the Wooster and Orrville Chambers and the Wayne Economic Development Council is particularly unique as students from every school district in the area are involved in helping solve the problem of connecting workers with employers in need of skilled labor.

"Manufacturing is critical to our country, and its certainly critical to our state and even more yet to Wayne County,"

said Wayne Girbach, with the Wayne Economic Development Council. as the county enjoys one of the greatest clusters of manufacturing jobs in the state of Ohio. "Whatever is true to the importance of manufacturing is more true in good old Wayne County.

This event is one of many we are doing to connect great career paths and to educate kids and their families on the wonderful career opportunities that manufacturing presents," Girbach added.

The 2017 Manufacturing Day will be the largest event of its kind in the state of Ohio as it features 13 industry partners who have opened their doors to students from 14 school districts.

Students will have the opportunity to see the needs of potential employers in their hometowns, and to learn about the types of jobs available as well as the salaries and benefits offered at these respected businesses.

"We're excited that we make things in Wayne County and we want to keep that going. But we need the next generation of workers to continue that," said Lori Reinbolt, president of the Orrville Chamber. "It's so important to provide an opportunity for students to see what great things are made in Wayne County and to see that there are great career opportunities close to home."

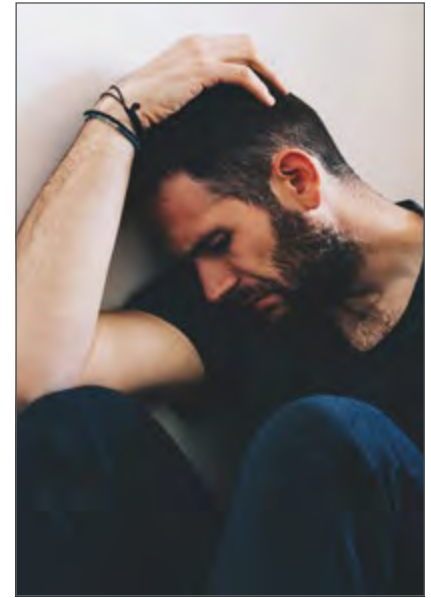


The Wooster Area Safety Council will meet on Wednesday, October 25th at Memories Party and Conference Center to hear from Dr. Nicole Labor on the topic of “Addiction & Drug Abuse”.

Dr. Labor graduated from Penn State University with a Bachelor of Science in Bio-Behavioral Health. She attended medical school at the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine. Nicole completed her Family Practice residency in Buffalo, New York. Following this, she completed a fellowship in Addiction Medicine through Geisinger in northeastern Pennsylvania. Currently, Dr. Nicole Labor is the Associate Medical Director of Addiction Medicine for Summa. She is also the Founder and Director of the Addiction Medicine Fellowship for Summa, Medical Director for Interval Brotherhood

Home, Medical Director for OneEighty in Wooster, and Medical Director for an opioid treatment center in Erie, Pennsylvania.

Dr. Labor is known in the addiction community for helping to educate healthcare providers, as well as patients and families on the disease of addiction in an understandable way. She seeks to dissolve the stigma around the disease and work with the community to promote healthy, sober living.

September Recap – Mental Illness in the Workplace

The Wooster Area Safety Council gathered at Memories Party & Conference Center on September 27th for their monthly meeting. The group listened to Helen Walkerly, Executive Director of the National Alliance on Mental Illness’s local affiliate. She addressed the topic of Mental Illness in the Workplace, a topic that is becoming more and more relevant in this day and age. Ms. Walkerly began her presentation with a shocking statistic, one in four Americans are diagnosed with some sort of mental illness. To drive the point closer to home, she noted that according to that statistic, two of the eight people seated at each table would be diagnosed with a mental illness.

In order to make everyone aware of how mental illness affects the workplace, Ms. Walkerly stated that over \$100 billion and 217 million workdays are lost annually due to mental illness. To make matters worse, employees fear discussing their illness and therefore do not seek help. According to Helen, there are five major categories of mental illness: Mood Disorders, Anxiety Disorders, Psychotic Disorders, Substance Abuse Disorders, and Engrained Personality Disorders. She continued by discussing some of the signs of Depression such as depressed mood, fatigue, hopelessness, etc.

Ms. Walkerly concluded by discussing how the Mental Health and Recovery Board can help if you notice someone who is depressed or is experiencing suicidal thoughts.

We would like to thank Ms. Walkerly for taking the time to speak and we hope that the information she presented will be beneficial to those in attendance.
