Safety Council talks Mental Health in the Workplace

The Wooster Area Safety Council will meet on Wednesday, September 27th to hear from Helen Walkerly of the National Alliance on Mental Illness and Mark Woods of Anazao Community Partners. Helen and Mark will be addressing the topic of Mental Health in the Workplace.

Helen Walkerly is a Licensed Independent Social Worker with Supervisory Designation for the local National Alliance on Mental Illness. Prior to being named Executive Director of the Organization in 2012, she served on their Board of Directors. Helen attended The University of Akron, where she also taught Social Services for 20 years.

Ms. Walkerly also attended The Ohio State University.

Mark Woods is the Executive Director of Anazao Community Partners, a comprehensive community behavioral health organization in Wooster. Also, a Supervising Licensed Independent Social Worker, Mark has been providing clinical interventions with adults, children, and families struggling with addiction and/or severe and persistent mental illness for more than 15 years. Mr. Woods holds both a Master's of Social Work and a Master's of Public Policy and Management from The Ohio State University.

Capt. Rotolo shares the Dangers of Distracted Driving

The Wooster Area Safety Council met on Wednesday, July 26th to hear from Captain Scott Rotolo of the Wooster Police Department. Captain Rotolo spoke on the topic of Distracted Driving and how to stay safe on the road. Scott explained that distracted driving is much more than just texting and driving. Distracted driving can be anything from applying makeup on the road to shaving or reading the newspaper while operating a motor vehicle. Mr. Rotolo also pointed out that texting and driving is a secondary offense, therefore a police officer cannot pull you over for just texting and driving. However, Captain Rotolo explained that the texting and driving law is more complex and comes with a number of exceptions including using a cellular device as a GPS or making an emergency call.



Scott concluded his presentation by driving the point closer to home for much of the audience. He relayed a few statistics showing how dangerous distracted driving can be. Captain Rotolo also showed the photos of a some of those who have been killed in distracted driving incidents resulting in death.

We would like to thank Captain Scott Rotolo for taking the time out of his day to present to the Wooster Area Safety Council and are confident that the information he provided had an impact on all of those who were in attendance.

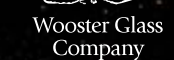

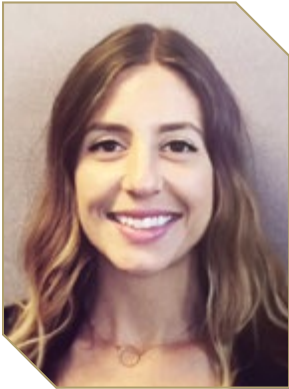

August Safety Council Recap OSHA Recordkeeping

The Wooster Area Safety Council gathered on Wednesday, August 23rd to hear from Cari Gray of the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation speak. Cari presented on the ins and outs of OSHA Recordkeeping. Prior to her presentation, Ms. Gray had the audience participate in a game in order to see how much they knew about the subject. She then began her presentation by defining the difference between "reportable" and "recordable" incidents. Her main point was that not all reportable items need to be recorded and vice versa. Ms. Gray also went over how to fill out your OSHA 300 log as well as What needs to be reported in terms of medical treatment beyond basic first aid. For example, use of non-prescription medications, cleaning wounds, and covering wounds with bandages are incidents that do not need to be reported. However, any incident that involves loss of consciousness or days away from work must be reported and recorded.

Cari went on to discuss where to find the reporting forms on the BWC website as well as how to fill them out. She concluded her presentation by discussing the top 5 reporting mistakes she sees from companies. These common mistakes include over reporting, not have the executive sign the form, and filling out the wrong form. We would like to thank Ms. Gray for taking the time to speak.


