Wayne Economic Forum

2019 Wayne Economic Forum a resounding success









The seventh annual Wayne Economic Forum was held on Thursday, October 24 at The Wooster Campus of The Ohio State University's Shisler Center. Opening the forum was John Stika, President of Certified Angus Beef, who shared how the company has grown its market, from humble beginnings in the late 1970's to today. He highlighted how the CAB brand has built a reputation that has resulted in consistent growth, especially in the last 15 years and overall market share in the international beef consumption market. Known as a top employer in the Wayne County area, Stika also shared how the company has been able to grow its workforce and retain talent through a focus on company culture, employee relations, and a comprehensive benefits package, that is both monetary and non-monetary.

Following Stika was Ohio's 51st Attorney General, Dave Yost, who shared an update on the political landscape in Columbus and how not only Federal, but State and Local Government can affect business. Attorney General Yost explained that businesses rely on consistency and predictability at all

levels of government, and much of this is dependant on the representatives in office.

The forum's third speaker was Jerry Grisko, President & CEO of CBIZ a leading provider of professional advisory services, focused on accounting, benefits and insurance and HR and payroll solutions. Jerry shared how he led an impressive 145 acquisitions in just 30 months in establishing CBIZ. He explained that CBIZ faced a number of challenges through its history including the lack of a corporate-wide culture and vision that employees could recognize. The company primarily focused on growth and scale its first 5 years and during that time the company struggled to secure talent and to retain employees. Recognizing that the success of the company hinged on its most important asset, keeping employees, the company shifted to focus on being a quality employer that offered unmatched corporate culture. Focus areas included educating employees on the values of the company, offering opening communication for all levels of employees and investing in the employees through benefits, support of

employee community involvement and workplace flexibility.



The Last speaker was

Bernie Moreno, President of Bernie Moreno Companies. He shared his personal story of coming to America with his mother and father from Columbia and working odd end jobs as a teenager to being a national leader in the development of blockchain technology in the greater midwest. Bernie shared that business success is not a magical equation, but rather the product of hard work, positive connections and following a gut instinct. Moreno shared how he has placed a significant amount of value on the development of the Greater Cleveland Area and that the acceptance of an alternative workplace environment and culture has led to securing the interest of many talented young professionals to his blockchain company. Originally a car salesman, Bernie shared many examples of his professional growth through the years and his investment in ventures at the right time and with the right people.

October Safety Council Recap: Using Drones Safely

October's Safety Council was all about drones. Josh Grappy, Digital Forensic Analyst - UAS Program Coordinator, spoke on the topic of Accident Investigation & the Use of 21st Century Technology.

Drones have proven helpful to perform bridge and tower inspections, volume calculations, and precision spraying on agricultural crops as well as numerous other uses.

There are some public safety concerns that come with flying drones. Therefore, a remote pilot certification is required according to FAA regulations. Drones must be operated in the daylight, right of way must be yielded to any manned aircraft and flight over people is prohibited.



The use of drones has allowed for images to be gathered while people stay in safer locations. For example, roof damage can be assessed without someone having to climb to the top of a house or building. If damage or an accident occur at a construction site, a drone may be useful to document where the damage is located. This has proven helpful

on sites where damage occurred in a location deemed unsafe for a person to inspect.

BWC offers drone program assistance where they will review policies and procedures, FAA regulations, provide equipment demonstrations among other services at no cost.

Manufacturing Day 2019 attended by over 600 students!

2019 Wayne County Manufacturing Day was held on Friday, October 11th and featured 17 manufacturers and over 600 students from 12 school districts. Recognized as the largest MFG Day in the State of Ohio, the event allowed students to visit two sites of their choosing. This individualized approach is unique to Manufacturing Days throughout the nation and is only possible through the



support of area school districts and coordination from the event organizers. For students participating in the day, they experienced a red-carpet tour of the manufacturers and were given details on the various career opportunities that exist in the manufacturing industry. With record-low unemployment in Wayne County, and a large number of employees reaching retirement years, the vitality of our local economy rests on assuring that the Manufacturing sector remains strong and that employers can find and attract the workforce needed for their respective operations. Most recently, the Chamber has been able to identify connections that have been made, which have resulted in both employment opportunities for student participants and filled jobs for industries. Plans have already begun for the implementation of Manufacturing Day 2020, which stands to be even bigger and better than in 2019.






